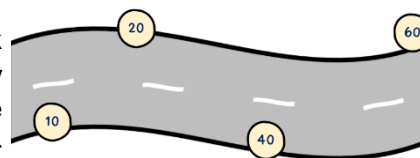
Reading at Chapelford Village Primary School

Reading is at the heart of learning at Chapelford Village Primary School. We believe that developing confident, fluent readers who enjoy books is one of the most important things we can do for our children. Reading supports learning across every area of the curriculum, develops vocabulary and imagination and opens the door to a lifetime of learning.

This year, we are delighted to continue our Reading Road reward scheme, which encourages children to read regularly at home and celebrates their commitment to reading.

What is the Reading Road?

Each time your child reads at home and this is recorded in their reading record or homework diary, they will make progress along their class Reading Road. Every child's reading journey is personal to them. We hope that regular reading becomes an enjoyable part of their routine and helps them to develop confidence, fluency and a genuine love of books that lasts a lifetime.



As they reach different milestones, they will receive special rewards:

- **10 reads** – Your child will select their own bookmark to keep.
- **20 reads** – Your child will earn a special reading certificate.
- **40 reads** – Your child will enjoy some special library time with a friend.

60 reads – Your child will receive a golden token to choose their very own book from our special book vending machines!

How can families help with reading at home?

Regular reading at home makes an enormous difference. Wherever possible, we encourage children to **read little and often**, rather than feeling that reading needs to be. Depending on your child's age and stage, this might include:

- reading their school reading book aloud to you;
- reading part of a longer book independently;
- sharing a story together;
- taking turns to read; or
- Listening to an adult read aloud and discussing the story together.

While reading, you can support your child by asking simple questions such as:

- *What has happened so far?*
- *What do you think might happen next? Why?*
- *What does this word mean?*
- *How do you think this character is feeling? What makes you think that?*
- *Can you find the part of the text that tells you that?*
- *What was your favourite part and why?*

Would you recommend this book to somebody else?

For younger readers, practising phonics sounds, blending unfamiliar words and recognising common words quickly is particularly valuable. For older and more fluent readers, talking about vocabulary, characters, themes, authors' choices and opinions about a text can be just as important as reading the words themselves.

Please record each home read in your child's reading record or homework diary. A short comment is absolutely fine. This helps us to celebrate their reading, monitor regular practice and move them along their class Reading Road. In Key Stage 2, as children become increasingly independent, we encourage them to record their own reading in their diaries, with a weekly signature from parents.



How do we teach reading in school?

Reading at Chapelford is taught through a carefully planned and progressive approach.



In Early Years and Year 1, reading is closely linked to our Read Write Inc. phonics programme, with a strong focus on decoding, blending, recognising words accurately and developing fluency and comprehension.

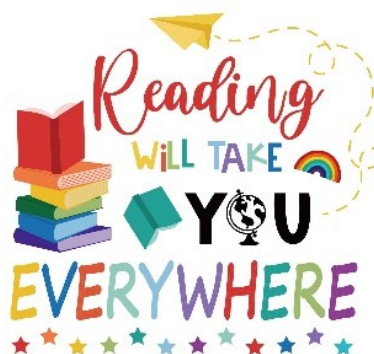
In Years 2–6, children take part in a whole-class shared reading lesson, where teachers explicitly introduce and model particular reading skills. These sessions explore high-quality texts and give children opportunities to develop skills such as predicting, understanding vocabulary, retrieving information, making inferences, summarising and explaining ideas.

Children also take part in guided reading sessions in smaller groups. Groups are organised using ongoing teacher assessment so that children read texts which provide the right balance of challenge and support. During these sessions, teachers revisit the week's reading skill, model useful reading strategies, listen carefully to children read and discuss the text with them. Children also complete follow-up and independent reading activities, giving them opportunities to apply the skills they have been taught and demonstrate that they can independently transfer and apply their reading skills.

Working Together

We are passionate that the most effective reading development happens when school and home work together. We want children to see reading not simply as homework or a school subject, but as something enjoyable, rewarding and valuable.

Thank you for supporting your child by listening to them read, talking to them about books and recording their home reading. Every read really does count, both towards their journey along Reading Road and, more importantly, towards becoming a confident and enthusiastic lifelong reader.

Key Reminders

Parking Around School Please be considerate when parking around the school at drop-off and pick-up times. We have received reports of several near misses recently. Nut-Free School Reminder A reminder that we are a **nut-free school**. Please do not send your child to school with any products containing nuts, including items such as Nutella. We have several children with severe nut allergies and your support is essential in helping us maintain a safe environment for everyone.

Supervision Before School Although the school gates may be open, we kindly ask that children are not on site unsupervised before 8:30am.
