They have also been reminding everyone about the importance of wearing helmets and pads while using the track, as well as being mindful of other users and following the rules to ensure everyone can have a great time.

Overall, the new pump track has been a huge success, and it has brought the community together in a positive way. It is a fantastic addition to Dakota Park, and we are excited to see children continue to enjoy and benefit from this new facility for years to come.

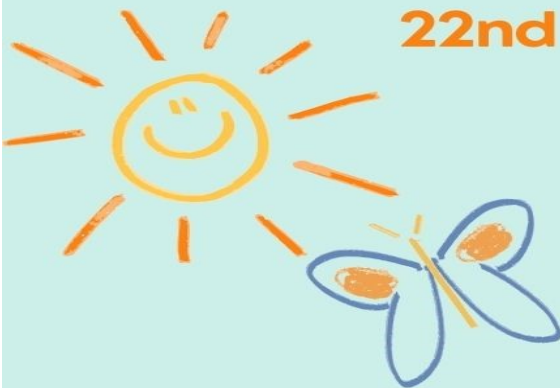
