Headteacher's Comment

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been especially lovely to see our EYFS children continuing to settle well into full-time school life here at Chapelford. They have been learning to come in independently, self-register by finding their picture, and start the day with some cheerful nursery rhymes. Over the coming weeks, they will begin exploring how they have changed since they were babies and identifying the important people in their lives by looking at photographs from different life stages. This is always a heartwarming topic and a wonderful way for our teachers to get to know the children even better.


