enhancing their understanding of biology in a playful and interactive way. Laughter and curiosity filled the air as the students joined in with the show!

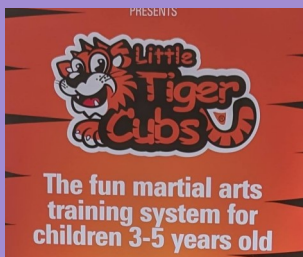
