





Animals Take Over Year 1

Year 1 students, particularly focusing on animal classification groups, were treated to an up-close encounter with a variety of fascinating creatures, ranging from the amphibians to the birds!

As the session began, the children's eyes widened with wonder as they were introduced to a bearded dragon, gecko, chinchilla, owl, frog, and snake. Each animal was accompanied by a knowledgeable handler who provided insights into their habitats, diets, and behaviours. 
















FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE
