We have had another extremely busy week in Chapelford with lots of hard work from all the children. With only one week left in school, it is great to see everyone enjoying their learning.

This week in EYFS the children have been reading the story Superkid and they have been discussing what is super about them. They have also been talking about the transition to Year 1. The children have been sharing their excitement and questions. The children are very excited to find out who their new teacher will be.

In Year 1, the children have been making arrays. They are exploring multiplication and division and the children have been learning about creating equal groups. In English, the children have been learning to use the 'ed' suffix and they have enjoyed re-writing their own versions of our class text. In PE, they have been honing their ball skills and practising their throwing and catching skills. The children have been enjoying the Kid Safe training and they have loved meeting KP the monkey.

Year 2 have had another super week. In English, they have been writing their own versions of one of their favourite books 'Grandad's Secret Giant'. The children have created their own fantastic giants and villages. The teachers were so impressed with how creative the children were! In Maths, the children have been carrying on their topic of measurement. They have been experimenting with the scales, comparing the mass of different objects and reading scales in grams and kilograms. In Science, the children have been looking at different habitats and micro-habitats. They went on a hunt around the school grounds to see how many micro-habitats they could spot! The teachers have also been so proud of Class 8 who have been completing their learning at home this week. They have all worked their socks off and have produced amazing work. Well done for such a great week Year 2, you are all superstars!

In Year three, the children have continued their learning of shape and begun to think about turning clockwise and anti-clockwise. In English they have written an eyewitness account as if they were the first person to see a giraffe roaming the streets of Paris. The children have enjoyed investigating why light sources are so important and how a shadow is created.

Year 4 had a visit from Warrington museum this week. This included a session looking at Roman artefacts which the children had chance to dress up in and use before sketching. The children also enjoyed taking part in a Roman warrior dance class where they created and learnt a routine. Finally, the children listened to Roman stories which include a tale about how Rome was named. The children had a fantastic day and loved sharing all their Roman knowledge with our guests!

This week, Year 5 have been on an incredible journey, a journey through time and space! Year 5 have delved into the world of the Ancient Egyptians and were lucky enough to spend a whole day with the museum exploring their language of hieroglyphics, ancient stories and artefacts! They learnt lots of new skills and also found a new love for everything old!

Year 6 have had a busy week of acting, singing and dancing as they have prepared for their end of year Leaver's assembly. More details of how to watch this will follow soon! As they approach their final week of primary school, they have been completing lots of transition activities to prepare them for September and the children cannot wait to see what surprises are in store for them at the leaver's festival for their Celebration day on Thursday !

As shared last week, this year, our normal end of year routines and celebrations will look a little different so we will be letting you know shortly what these will look like. We always collect in reading books at the end of the year so we would be grateful if you could help us and return any previous books that your child may have had to the class teacher. Please keep hold of your child's current guided reading books so you can continue to support with reading at home.

Many parents and carers will be looking for childcare providers and other out of school settings during the summer holidays. Last year the government published a voluntary code of practice for out of schools settings, and it might well be worth sharing the parents' leaflet about the code.

CORONAVIRUS INFORMATION

Changes to the Test and Support payment for parents

Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their schools or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a Test and Trace Support Payment or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria. The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment Scheme is intended to ensure that parents receive the financial support they need if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities.

Applications for the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme are made via the local authority in which the parent or carer resides, not the local authority where the school is situated if these are different.

To be eligible applicants must meet all the criteria that:

*They are the parent or guardian of a child or young person in the same household and need to take time off work to care for them while they self-isolate. This is limited to one parent or guardian per household for the child or young person's self-isolation period.

*They are employed or self-employed.

*They cannot work from home while undertaking caring responsibilities and will lose income as a result.

*They meet all the other means-tested eligibility criteria for a Test and Trace Support.

*Payment or locally determined criteria for a discretionary payment.

That their child:

*Is aged 15 or under (or 25 or under with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC)) and normally attends an education childcare setting.

*Has been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or by someone who has tested positive for Covid-19.

Primary school pupils and rapid asymptomatic testing

On advice from Public Health England (PHE), pupils in primary schools and children in nursery settings are not included in the rapid asymptomatic testing programme.

PHE has advised that there are currently limited public health benefits to testing primary-aged pupils with lateral flow devices (LFD). In addition, primary-aged pupils, particularly younger children, may find the LFD testing process unpleasant and are unable to self-swab.

We are advising that primary-aged pupils should only be tested if they are symptomatic, in which case their families should follow the [guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection](#) and [book a PCR test](#) for the child.

FACE COVERINGS

In primary schools and early years settings it is recommended that staff and visitors wear face coverings where social distancing cannot be maintained between adults.

As with all measures, we will keep this under review and update guidance as needed.

A face covering is not PPE and can be a scarf, bandana or hand made cloth which fits around the face.

Please remember to wear a face covering and follow our one-way system for the safety all.
