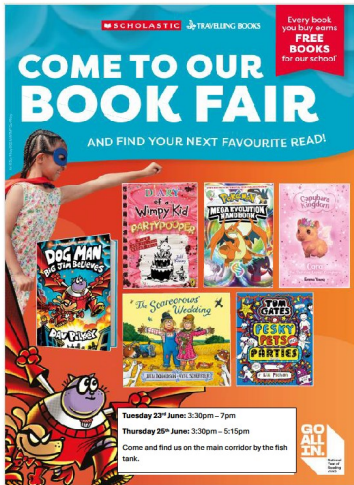

## Snack Ordering System Update - Pre-order via ParentMail

Since the start of this half term, our new system for ordering morning snack has been in place. Thank you to everyone for their support as we have navigated through this change.

A few useful reminders:

- Meals can be confirmed and paid for up to four weeks in advance.
- Bookings can be made up to 12:00pm the evening before.
- If your child is absent, meal balances will be credited so no money is lost.
- If you still have a ParentPay balance that needs refunding as you are not wanting to use the balance for lunches, please let the school office know.

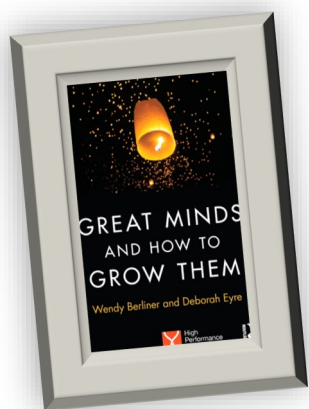
