This week, the children have been wearing their ribbons with pride to show that as a school, we promote positive values and stand together against bullying. There have been a range of exciting activities to help the children understand the importance of being united against bullying. All around school there have been raps and songs, poems and stories which have also encouraged the children think about diversity and equality.

On Monday EYFS had a visitor, Stick Man, who needed their help to get back to his family tree. They read the story Stick Man to help them make a map for him. All week EYFS have been looking at anti-bullying and what makes a good friend. They read the Simon Sock story and discussed how we are all different but can still be friends. They made jigsaw pieces showing that we all fit together.

Year 1 have really thrown themselves into Anti-Bullying Week and loved Odd Socks Day. Not only did they enjoy showing off their most peculiar pairings of socks, they all learnt a valuable lesson about the reasons why we started the week off this way. This week the children have celebrated difference from start to finish and we have no doubt that they will continue to show respect for diversity both in school and out. They were very lucky to make a new friend in their ICT lesson, when they met Tag. He taught them all about how to keep themselves safe online when accepting friend requests and communicating via messages, emails, on social media and when gaming.

This week, the Year 2 children have continued to make their teachers incredibly proud with all of the hard work and dedication they have been putting into their home learning. They have enjoyed taking part in challenges for 'Odd Socks Day' and blew their teachers away with their balancing skills! In maths, the children have been using their knowledge of addition and subtraction to tackle bigger problems. Their reasoning skills have been amazing! Keep up the fantastic work Year 2.

The children in year 3 have been very creative this week. After reading the story of Simon Sock, the children made their own characters and retold their own versions of the story. They also created a class rap thinking about bullying and how to behave in our school to ensure that everyone is happy and treated fairly. In maths, they have been using number lines to help them add and subtract.

This week year 4 have been consolidating their knowledge of addition column method and have enjoyed solving some big problems. In English they have been reading more of their book 'Leon and the Place Between' and writing diary entries as one of the characters. For anti-bullying week, they have explored the story of Simon Sock and then wrote and designed their own sock characters and stories. We have written and performed their own anti-bullying songs and have learnt more about online bullying. In RE this week, the children have really enjoyed learning about Islam.

Our year 5 children are blossoming into brilliant mathematicians as they have faced many challenges within written methods for addition and subtraction. They have applied their skills to a range of problems including money, so hopefully on their next shopping trip they will be able to calculate the total and the change before the checkouts can! Along with this, the children have been developing their empathy skills as they delved into anti-bullying week. The children are understanding the importance of equality and how to we can celebrate our differences to make us a better community.

Year 6 have been researching and exploring critically endangered animals, applying their knowledge to a hybrid text- using formal and persuasive language. In science, the children have been exploring the human body, looking at what blood is made of and what are the purposes of it. They were shocked to find that an adult human body has around 5 litres of blood! As it is anti-bullying week we have been doing lots of work on what makes us all unique and why this is a good thing and something to be celebrated.

Many of our children already do, but we are encouraging all of our children to read at home in order to be entered into the weekly reading raffle. The class with the highest percentage of children entered into the raffle from each year group, will earn an extra break. We will be posting the percentages on the classroom windows so the children can see who are the winners. Please continue to support your child by listening to them read at home and signing their reading record. Thank you.
