It's been another busy week across the school and especially in EYFS where the children have been learning all about hygiene and how to keep themselves fit and healthy. They looked at the importance of germs, what germs are and the best way to get rid of the bad germs. They thoroughly enjoyed completing an experiment with glitter where they watched how quickly it spreads around the classroom after being on their hands. They also looked at brushing teeth and the different types of foods that are good and bad for our teeth.

Year 1 have started their new book, Big Bad Owl and they were really excited to create 'wanted' posters for the main character, Scowl the Grumpy Owl. In Science, the children have been learning about the parts of the tree and they created our own bark rubbings to compare different types of trees on our grounds. In Art, they have continued with their space collages which are looking amazing!

In English, the Year 2 children have been writing letters to persuade the reader to plant more trees to help the endangered animals. The children were amazing at using conjunctions, such as 'because' and 'so that' to provide their very persuasive reasoning. In Maths, the children have been applying their knowledge of division to games. The children had so much fun comparing their scores! The children have also made a fantastic start in DT and have designed their own waterproof cape for Little Red. They thought carefully about which materials were waterproof and soft as no one would like to wear a rigid cape! The children are really excited to make and evaluate our capes next week.

The text "Journey" has been the inspiration for our Year 3 children to write some amazing adventure stories this week. The children are rightly proud of their finished writing and so are their teachers. In Maths, the children have been learning to tell the time on an analogue clock. The children love learning their spellings through games and this week has been no exception. They have been learning about our words.

Year 4 have continued to explore and investigate how sound is made. This week they investigated patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it, using the Science Journal App. In Maths we have continued to build on our knowledge of tenths and hundredths. Using this knowledge we have reasoned using Vocab Vic and problem solved to develop our understanding.

This week, Year 5 have delved into the world of decimals! Now, for many, decimals are difficult and confusing but not for them. Throughout the week, they have explored the relationships between fractions and their decimal equivalents and have enjoyed looking at any patterns or links between tenths, hundredths and thousandths. As we continue to look at decimals, Year 5 are ready for a HUGE challenge, and we cannot wait to see what they produce! Good luck!

This week Year 6 have been continuing to look at their artist: Felix Nussbaum, using his work to inspire their own collages. The children have also loved being scientists, discovering how light travels and how we are able to see objects. They looked at the legacy and life of Queen Victoria in History. Next week, they will be evaluating all five Monarchs and deciding which one had the greatest impact on our history.

In response to the easing of some restrictions, we have kept the front gates open to enable parents to access the reception area. We ask that it is one person inside at a time and continuing contacting us remotely if at all possible.

CORONAVIRUS INFORMATION

Changes to the Test and Support payment for parents

Parents and carers of children who have been advised to self-isolate by their schools or by NHS Test and Trace are now able to apply for a Test and Trace Support Payment or discretionary payment of £500, if they meet the eligibility criteria. The extension of the Test and Trace Support Payment Scheme is intended to ensure that parents receive the financial support they need if they are unable to attend work due to childcare responsibilities.

Applications for the Test and Trace Support Payment scheme are made via the local authority in which the parent or carer resides, not the local authority where the school is situated if these are different.

To be eligible applicants must meet all the criteria that:

*They are the parent or guardian of a child or young person in the same household and need to take time off work to care for them while they self-isolate. This is limited to one parent or guardian per household for the child or young person's self-isolation period.

*They are employed or self-employed.

*They cannot work from home while undertaking caring responsibilities and will lose income as a result.

*They meet all the other means-tested eligibility criteria for a Test and Trace Support.

*Payment or locally determined criteria for a discretionary payment.

That their child:

*Is aged 15 or under (or 25 or under with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC)) and normally attends an education childcare setting.

*Has been told to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace or by someone who has tested positive for Covid-19.

Primary school pupils and rapid asymptomatic testing

On advice from Public Health England (PHE), pupils in primary schools and children in nursery settings are not included in the rapid asymptomatic testing programme.

PHE has advised that there are currently limited public health benefits to testing primary-aged pupils with lateral flow devices (LFD). In addition, primary-aged pupils, particularly younger children, may find the LFD testing process unpleasant and are unable to self-swab.

We are advising that primary-aged pupils should only be tested if they are symptomatic, in which case their families should follow the [guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus \(COVID-19\) infection](#) and [book a PCR test](#) for the child.

FACE COVERINGS

In primary schools and early years settings it is recommended that staff and visitors wear face coverings where social distancing cannot be maintained between adults. These measures will be in place until Easter. As with all measures, we will keep this under review and update guidance as needed. A face covering is not PPE and can be a scarf, bandana or hand made cloth which fits around the face.

Please remember to wear a face covering and follow our one-way system for the safety all.

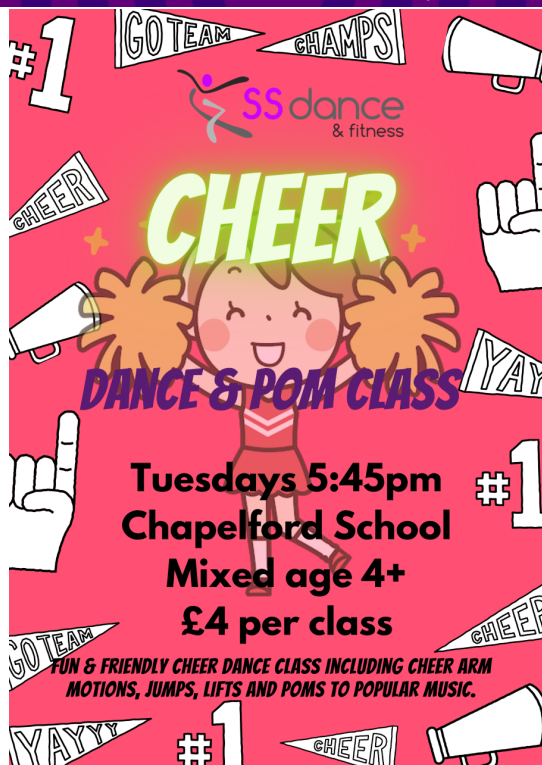
