Health & Safety Reminders

- Reminder vaping is prohibited on the school grounds. Please do not use your vape until you are on the outside of the school gates. Thank you for your co-operation.

We would like to encourage all parents and children to leave the grounds after pick-up so that the site can be secured and gates locked. Thank you for your co-operation.

Front car park works

As part of the recent extension work to increase the capacity at KS2, it was also agreed to increase capacity to the staff parking facility at the front on the school. The preparation work for this will commence on Monday 25th March.

The visitor car park will not be accessible at this time, the pedestrian path alongside school will still be accessible, with a fence around the perimeter of the compound to keep the area secure. The works will involve minimal disruption to school life and parental drop off and pick up.

Lost Property

Over the first two terms we have accumulated a number of items of lost property within the school, in an attempt to return these to their owners, each class will place a clear box outside the collection door of their classroom each Friday with lost property items. You will be able to review items in there and collect any that belong to your child.

Any items that are clearly labeled are always given back to the child in the first instance, so please try to write your child's name on their items of clothing and other belongings (eg water bottle, lunch box).

Items that are not collected at the end of the term will be collated and recycled by the school.
