In Maths, the children have been comparing the temperatures of different countries and have been helping their teachers decide where to go on holiday based on their knowledge of temperature. The Year 2 teachers would like to say a massive well done to all of their pupils. They have made them unbelievably proud and they have thoroughly enjoyed every minute of teaching them. The last week in Year 3 has been full of learning, fun and laughter! The children have enjoyed their science learning looking at shadows and making a shadow puppet show. All the classes have enjoyed completing their DT projects making a tower bridge lever and most of them were successful! They have also looked at how to be safe in the sun and have watched videos and created posters to inform. The children were all shocked at how dangerous the sun can actually be. Year 3 has been a year the teachers and children have all thoroughly enjoyed and will remember. The teachers hope everyone has a long, well-deserved summer break.

Year 4 have enjoyed a sunny last week in year 4, starting their week with a visit from their new year 5 teachers! The children have been busy writing their own version of Wisp A story of hope in English, showcasing this terms mastery skills! The children then completed another experiment looking at the water cycle and condensation as part of their science module; states of matter.
