Today you will also receive your child's spring term report – if you have any queries or questions regarding these please contact your child's class teacher.

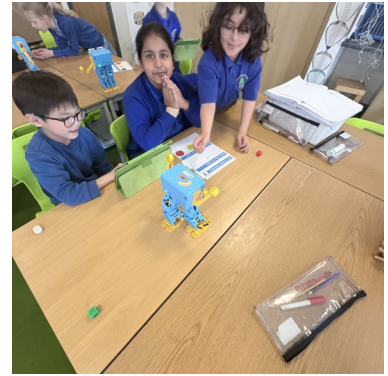
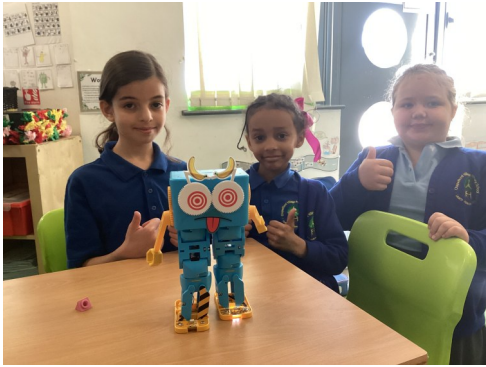
