

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
In English, the children have the opportunity to look at a book that is enriched with beautiful vocabulary and imagery. Here, they will create narratives, setting/character descriptions containing Year 5 and 6 Mastery Keys.



The texts are:
Galapagos Island

In Maths, Year 6 will be focusing on the Fluency aspect of Maths. That will be looking at the four operations: addition and subtraction, multiplication and division. Here, the children will decide on the correct method to apply to the question - mental or written. This may be seen through measurement, fractions, money and inverse. We will also recap their prior learning to support when working towards their assessments.

In Science, the children will be studying the classification of living things and evolution. This will include looking at how animals and living things can be classified and characteristics of vertebrates.



In PE, Year 6 will be focusing on outdoor, adventurous activities. Here, they will participate in orienteering activities and using a map confidently.

During Art sessions, the children will build on the painting skills they have developed in previous years. Their final piece will reflect a time in history: The second World War.

During DT sessions, they will continue to create electrical systems to make their own motorized version of car.



In History, Year 6 will be looking at how conflict changed Warrington in World War 2 through evidence and past findings.

In Geography, the children will look at how they can protect the world and the impact climate change has on the world around them. They will look at renewable energy and form their own opinion on how to approach the change in movement.

In Computing, Year 6 will develop their digital literacy skills by inventing and designing their own product as a showcase of the computing knowledge and skills they have learned.

In RE, the overarching question for Year 6 will be, **Is life like a journey?** This half term, we will be looking at this question from a Christian's perspective.

In PSHE, we will be discussing having human rights, and how they can affect our right to education.



During Music, Year 6 have taken part of an online Gospel workshop. The children have had so much fun already in Spring 1, we can't wait to continue in Spring 2!
