Reading is an essential life skill that once mastered, opens the world for all of our children. Children who are good at reading, read more and learn more. However, children do not just become readers and engagement with reading won't happen if children struggle with fluency which in turn, impacts on their enjoyment. From our youngest children in EYFS through to our year 6 pupils, careful teaching and frequent practice are how children develop fluency and comprehension skills in a variety of texts.

Fluency comes with practice and so our weekly reading challenge is one way in which we reward those pupils reading at home. All children are expected to read five times a week either with an adult or independently. If a child reads five times a week at home and has their reading record signed, they are entered into a reading raffle. A winner in each class is drawn and a treat is awarded to that child. At the end of every half term, those weekly winners are put into another raffle and the winner of each class chooses a book as a prize. In addition, the class with the highest percentage of readers at home for that week, wins a class treat. A massive well done to class 20, the week's overall winners, with 87% of children reading five times. This week, the class teachers have been encouraging their classes to increase those percentages and to aim for 100% of children completing the challenge next week.

We know that your time is precious and you all lead busy lives so we really appreciate your support with helping your child practice their reading at home. 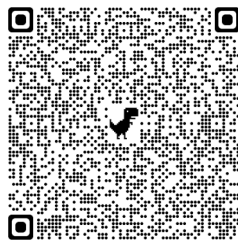
