

In the mornings, the children complete their Level 1 training off-road on the school playground, focusing on bike control and safe practices. After mastering this, they then take to the roads to experience real cycling and put their skills into action in a safe, controlled environment. It's been a pleasure to watch them grow in confidence as they learn these vital life skills!




Please be reminded that SAT's revision books are still available to purchase on Parentmail.
