A very warm welcome back to our year 2 children and staff. It is lovely to see all of their excited faces in the classrooms and once again have a full school. During their time at home, the learning the children completed was amazing and we are so proud of you all.

EYFS have been busy learning about the different parts of a pirate ship and even had a go at designing their own. They are enjoying their phonics sessions and were very excited to meet Fred Frog this week. They also enjoyed PE where they practised their catching skills.

To celebrate Harvest, year 1 have been learning how to grow food. The children have been superstars with their reading and are showing they are making fantastic progress. Class 5 are absolutely engrossed when they are listening to The Twits. They cannot stop laughing. The children are loving Forest Schools and spending time outside.

Year 2 have been imagining all the things Tabitha, the cheeky and loopy child from their class text Troll Swap, would do if she was able to live with the trolls. They put themselves into her shoes and thought like her! They have been developing their knowledge of the properties of different materials and can now discuss if something is absorbent or waterproof, opaque or transparent and if it would sink or float.

This week, year 3 began their Science learning topic about Living Things and their habitats. They have been on a hunt around school to find things that are alive, not alive and things that have never been alive. In Maths, the children were learning to order and compare numbers and explain their understanding of this. They continued to read 'Seal Surfer' by Michael Foreman in English and have written a recount/ diary from the main character, Tom's, point of view. The children worked hard to express how Tom felt about the seals disappearance. They also made up a class rap in RE to think about why Harvest Festival is celebrated. They had a lot of fun performing it.

Year 4 have been busy comparing and testing a range of rocks to investigate their durability and permeability. They have also been writing their own version of the story Gorilla by Anthony Browne and describing a moonlit adventure with an animal of their choice.

The Queen of the Falls herself, Annie Edson Taylor, has taken over year 5 this week with her daredevil stunt. In fact, they were so impressed that they decided she deserved to be included in the Goodnight Story for Rebel Girls alongside other great woman who changed history such as Rosa Parkes, Maya Angelou and the Williams sisters.

CSI came to Chapelford this week to year 6. As the children entered their classrooms, they were met with a professor Brainstorm's abandoned laboratory. They were tasked with identifying and classifying the materials within his lab to work out how he created an explosive device. The children are completely enthralled reading The Boy in The Striped Pyjamas and are eagerly anticipating the next chapter.
