## Headteacher's Comment



Dear families,

As we come to the end of another busy week, I would like to begin by thanking everyone in our school community who attended and supported our Summer Fair on Wednesday. Whilst the weather wasn't quite as glorious as it was last year, it certainly didn't stop families, friends and staff from coming together to enjoy a fantastic afternoon. There was a wonderful atmosphere across the school, with plenty of fun, laughter and community spirit on display. We would also like to extend our sincere thanks to the many local businesses who supported the event, either by attending as traders or by generously donating prizes for our raffle. Your support is greatly appreciated and helps us continue to provide opportunities and experiences for our children.

I would also like to thank everyone for their patience as we trial our new system for ordering and paying for toast, milk and juice in Key Stage 2. This change has been necessary following Warrington Borough Council's decision to discontinue the snack provision previously available to schools. As a result, if we wanted to continue offering snack to our children, we needed to find an alternative solution and organise the provision ourselves.

We know how important this service is for many families and were keen to ensure children could still access snack during the school day. Looking ahead, we would love to expand this provision to include Key Stage 1 and offer a wider range of snack options.

As we continue to trial and refine the system, we genuinely welcome feedback, questions and suggestions, as these will help us reflect on what is working well and identify any areas for improvement. Whilst feedback is important and valued, we will be continuing with the current system during the trial period so that we can gather meaningful information before considering any future changes.

Next week, our Year 1 children will complete their Phonics Screening Check. This is a statutory assessment completed by Year 1 pupils across the country. Our children have been learning phonics from the moment they joined us in Reception and we know they will do themselves proud. If you have any questions about the screening check, please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher.

A reminder that Monday is Class Photograph Day. This is for class photographs only, so all children should attend school in their full school uniform rather than PE kit.

We would also like to remind families that electric scooters are not permitted on the school grounds. This is for the safety of all children, families and staff as we arrive and leave school each day. We appreciate your support in helping us keep our site safe for everyone.

Parents' Evening letters have been sent home today, so please take the time to read the information and book an appointment. End-of-year review meetings provide a valuable opportunity to reflect on the progress children have made, celebrate their achievements and discuss next steps as they prepare for the next stage of their learning journey. If you have any questions regarding Parents' Evening, please contact your child's class teacher.

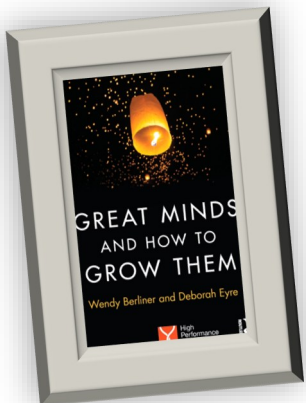
