If anyone has any spare underwear they could donate to school this would be greatly appreciated. Please drop these items off at the school office.

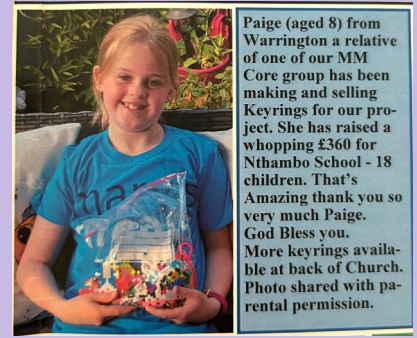

Parking Safety Reminders

We have a few important reminders to ensure the safety and smooth operation of our school parking area.

To maintain a safe environment for all our children, family, staff and visitors, please adhere to the following guidelines when using the school car park:

1. One-Way System: Please follow the designated one-way route at all times. This helps to manage traffic flow and ensures everyone's safety.
2. Allocated Parking Spaces: Ensure you park only in the spaces allocated for parents and visitors. Do not park in staff-only or reserved areas.
3. Disabled Parking: The disabled parking spaces are reserved for those with valid permits. Please do not use these spaces or wait in these spaces unless you have a legitimate need and the appropriate permit.
4. Zebra Crossing: Always support and use the zebra crossing. It is essential for the safety of pedestrians, especially during busy drop-off and pick-up times.

Health & Safety Reminders

- ◆ **Reminder vaping is prohibited on the school grounds. Please do not use your vape until you are on the outside of the school gates. Thank you for your co-operation.**
- ◆ May we ask for support with the safe use and enjoyment of the climbing frame by ensuring children do not use it before and after school.
- ◆ Could we please politely remind parents to take care driving around both front and rear car parks at school drop off and pick up times, paying particular attention to the crossings as there have been a few near misses this week. Thanks in advance for your support with this as we all work together to keep our children safe.
- ◆ Smart Watches are not to be worn for school.
- ◆ E-SCOOTERS. Please can we take care on arrival to school on e-scooters.
- ◆ Bikes and scooters must **NOT** be ridden until outside of the school grounds!
- ◆ All ballgames including football are not to be played on the school playgrounds during drop-off and pick-up.
- ◆ School Gym Equipment is for pupils during the school day only.
- ◆ Please remember that dogs except for assistance dogs are NOT permitted on school grounds under any circumstances.

ParentPay

Can we request that children's ParentPay accounts are regularly topped up, to make sure the children continue to receive their school lunches and snacks.

Free School Meals end for pupils at the end of Year 2. School lunch is £2.60 per person per day it to be paid via Parentpay.
