become an annual mass celebration to encourage everyone to enjoy and share poetry. This year's celebration was held on Thursday and the theme was choice.

Year 3 had great fun learning how to write kennings which is where the noun is replaced by a phrase of two words. The children told us that they loved playing with the vocabulary and exploring new ideas. Meanwhile, our EYFS children thoroughly enjoyed listening to and joining in with counting rhymes and songs. Many of these traditional rhymes that children still enjoy today are probably ones that you would remember from when your own school days!
