<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CVPS is part of OMEGA Multi Academy Trust, we currently educate 596 children. • We are three forms of entry across the school. • We are a new school build but an existing primary school with a heritage of over 45 years! As a result, we have taught several generations of families and we are well established within the community of Great Sankey and Chapelford. • We are currently organised into 21 classes across the school. • When children start with us in Early Years they come to us from over 24 different preschool settings across Warrington. • Chapelford Village Primary School is a state of the art building which opened in 2013 and was extended further in 2015 • Over 65 staff work with passion and commitment each day at Chapelford Village to ensure that we are an exceptional, welcoming and safe school. • Our children have a real voice within the school and make valuable contributions to the life of the school - children are central at CVPS. • Children that attend Chapelford Village are exceptional and welcome newcomers to the school with friendliness and warmth. • We benefit from trusting and supportive parents who support the school well. • We work closely with other schools locally and across Warrington to support CVPS. 	<p>We have four main priorities this year:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Further embed our "Chapelford Signature Curriculum" to improve outcomes for pupil's further, with a key focus on developing pupils' long term memory to our year group end points. • To further develop consistency in pupil's behaviour and attitudes ensuring that all pupils demonstrate respect for diversity and difference in all forms across the school. • To further extend the personal development curriculum for all pupils to ensure that they are supported and integrated well back into school post Covid19 absence. • To further enhance the impact and role of subject leaders, with a specific focus on securing improvements in the quality of teaching and its impact on learning across all curriculum subjects. • To drive the consistency of the existing good or better teaching in the Early Years, with a key focus on assessment of and for learning. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At Chapelford Village Primary School, we follow the National Curriculum as a framework for our curriculum. However, we have carefully designed our Signature Curriculum and provision to ensure that our children receive an education that fulfils our school Vision, Mission Statement and Ethos. • Our curriculum aims to ensure our children are learning for life (i.e. they learn things that they remember for life AND are able to keep learning for the whole of their lives). • Our learning experiences aim to develop long term, memorable knowledge and skills which can be applied flexibly. Therefore, our curriculum prioritises ALL curriculum subjects. • We aim for our curriculum to reflect the diversity of the local and wider global community ensuring equality and respect for all. • As a school we place emphasis on positive relationship and to promote this we teach a Values based curriculum that promotes respect and harmony across the school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • "The best school in the world."
