

Topic

This half term we will be learning all about the season winter, the changes in the environment and how different animals adapt. We will also be learning about the different animals that live in cold climates. To support your child's learning, you could look for signs of winter when you are outdoors, talk about the changes in the weather and read stories that are set in winter.



Literacy

This half term we will be focusing on orally rehearsing a short sentence of 3/4 words, using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops and reading back our own writing to make sure it makes sense.

We will be introducing nonfiction texts, talking about the different parts and writing our own facts about penguins.

We will be practising handwriting daily and focusing on using correct letter formation, size and position.

Our texts this half term



Reading

This half term, we are focusing on the children securing the set 1 special friend sounds. Your child will be working on recognising special friends in words. E.g sh-shop. We will support your child to read the word 'shop-sh-o-p, rather than s-h-o-p.'

We are starting to introduce 'Fred in your head' to the children. This is when they sound out in their head and say the word out loud. This supports reading fluency and helps children to recognise repeated words in a text without the need to sound out each time.

Your child will receive a new reading book once a week. We ask that they read this book to you at home at least 3 times during the week. If your child has read 3 times in the week and their reading record is signed, then they will get 3 dojos in school. Reading phonic books matched to their phonic ability regularly will support your child to read with confidence and pace. Can reading books and records please be kept in book bags daily so we always have them ready.




Maths
