This visit is part of a new community link we have recently established, and we hope to offer many of our other children the opportunity to take part in similar visits soon.

On Friday 5th December, all children across the school will be taking part in a festive run as part of our fundraising efforts to support St Rocco's Hospice. Please note that after the performance, teachers will return the children to their classrooms to register them before dismissing them from their usual classroom doors.
