Home learning

Please ensure that your child has their story book in their book bag every Friday so that they can swap it for a new story. These books are for you to read to your child to encourage a love of reading. This is an opportunity for your child to see you as a reader, as well as hearing and enjoying a range of stories. You could discuss the front cover, the pictures, the characters and the settings within the book. This will benefit your child in becoming confident at unpicking and recognising the structure of texts.

We ask that your child reads their phonics book to you at least 5 times per week. The following week your child will read a new book with their class teacher and their previous book will be collected in. Maths Homework

We will send maths home learning out every two weeks. The activity that we send home will be learning that has already taken place in school and therefore your child should be able to complete with some independence, once you have explained the activity.

The first maths home learning will be sent out on 19th January. This will need to be in handed in to your child's class teacher by 26th January and the next piece of home learning will be given out the following Friday.

Learning challenge

Our theme this half term will be about People who help us. We will find out about different types of jobs that people do to help us, how people help us, what to do in an emergency, who to go to when you need help, who would be a safe stranger and lots more!

General reminders

Could you all ensure that children carry their water bottles separately and they are not placed in book bags as this can damage reading books and letters. Can we ask that all P.E. kits are now brought back into school. P.E. kits will be sent home after the last P.E. session of the half term to be washed and we ask that they are back in for the first P.E. session of the new half term.
