Dear Parents and Carers,

We are delighted to let you know that we will be celebrating **Number Day on Friday 6th February**.

Number Day is a special opportunity for pupils to enjoy mathematics in a fun, practical and meaningful way. Throughout the day, children will take part in a range of engaging activities designed to help them develop key mathematical skills, including fluency, reasoning and problem-solving. These activities will be rooted in real-life contexts and encourage collaboration, discussion and creative thinking.

Each year group will take part in a maths activity carefully planned and supported by the maths team around their year-group objectives. These activities will be delivered in an enjoyable and accessible way, allowing pupils to explore mathematical ideas with confidence and enthusiasm.

Although Number Day is promoted by the NSPCC and is often used as a fundraising event, we would like to confirm that **we will not be fundraising on this occasion**. We are always very grateful for the kind donations and support we receive from parents, but we also want to carefully balance this with being mindful of how often families are asked to contribute. Therefore, there is **no expectation for donations** for Number Day.



As part of Number Day, all children in **Years 2–6** will also have the opportunity to take part in an exciting **Times Tables Rock Stars competition**. We will be launching a whole-school TT Rockstars NSPCC Rocks Challenge, designed to help pupils continue building fluency in their times tables both in school and at home. Every correct answer will help their class climb the leaderboard, encouraging teamwork, motivation, and plenty of fun along the way. The challenge will be officially launched in Friday's Celebration assembly and each class will have up to one hour per day to take part.

To recognise pupils' efforts, there will be prizes awarded at the end of the competition. Certificates will be presented to the **top three classes across the school**, with each winning class earning an extra OPAL play time! In addition, certificates will be awarded to the **top three pupils across the school**, and each of these pupils will receive 100 house points for their winning house.

We would also like to encourage you to support your child by helping them access **Times Tables Rock Stars at home as often as possible**. All children should already have a unique login recorded in their home learning diary. Regular practice will help strengthen recall and build confidence in maths. If you need a reminder of your child's log in, please contact your child's class teacher.



Please also look out updates on our school Facebook page throughout the day, where we will be sharing highlights from Number Day.

By the end of the day, we hope pupils will demonstrate greater confidence, enjoyment and engagement in mathematics, while seeing how maths is relevant and useful in everyday life.
