<u>English</u>

For World Book day, we will be reading 'Room on The Broom' by Julia Donaldson. We will be working from this book for two weeks. The children will be able to get creative, writing character descriptions of the witch and deciding who they would take on their magical broom. Then we will be moving onto 'The Deep Dark Wood,' and our focus will be to write fantastic setting and character descriptions.

Phonics is a top priority in Year 1, emphasising the need for children to read their books at least three times a week. Check out E-Books on the Oxford Owl Website (password in reading record). We're also diving into a term of Benji Davis author study, enjoying his works during daily shared reading.

Remember, reading together is key. Share any book recommendations in your child's reading record or bring them in—we love discovering new stories! Let's keep the reading excitement alive in Year 1!



Maths

Year 1 maths allows lots of opportunities to re-visit our learning and consolidate what we have learnt. We are currently re-visiting our topic of place value – but this time with numbers to 50. Children will be looking at recognising and representing these numbers whilst accessing some reasoning questions with support to further their knowledge. Number formation is still a big focus in year 1. This is something that all children could practise at home. The children will continue to have the opportunity to access our fantastic outdoor provision area and using our equipment to consolidate their learning.

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Reading

The Year 1 team are always reviewing your child's phonics progress and their book band. Phonics and reading are a massive focus in Year 1. If you would like any tips on how to support your child's phonics development at home or their reading, please contact the Year 1 team. It is important that children have their reading book and their reading record in their book **every day**. This is important as we collect their old books in on the day of their teacher led reading session. Please note, children need to be using a school book bag as



we have no where to store larger rucksacks/bags that do not fit in their tray. Ensure that you write a comment in your child's reading record three times a week in order to be entered into the reading raffle. We review your child's reading record each Friday.

Snacks and water bottles

 Please send your child to school with a water bottle containing water only.



- A healthy snack will be provided by the school daily. This is usually an apple, pear, banana, orange or raisins.
- We are seeing increasing amounts of children bringing chocolate bars and crisps for snack time. If your child would prefer to bring in their own healthy snack, a reminder that this needs to be a piece of fruit as we want to promote making healthy choices.

PE will take place every Wednesday and Thursday, however these days can be subject to change so please ensure your child has their PE kit in school every day. All items need to be labelled.

<u>Uniform</u>

A gentle reminder that children are required to wear formal school shoes. We are seeing an increasing amount of year 1 children wearing trainers.
