We launched straight into our new book *Big Bad Owl*, sparking imaginations and inspiring the children to create their own fantastical tales of adventure. Our literary journey will continue later this term with *Space Tortoise*.

Alongside our creative work, we're also focusing on key High Performance Learning (HPL) skills as we get ready for the upcoming Phonics Screening Check. The children are developing their Advanced Cognitive Performance by building their skills in **Realising** and **Automaticity** – recognising phonics sounds instantly, improving memory of key graphemes, and increasing speed and accuracy when decoding words.

It's shaping up to be a term full of learning, achieving and respect. Let's make it one to remember!

English



Core texts: "The Big Bad Owl" by Steve Smallman and "Space Tortoise" by Ross Montgomery.

This term, we're thrilled to explore the delightful tales of "Big Bad Owl" and "Space Tortoise" with your children! As we journey through these enchanting stories, we'll focus on important skills like using capital letters for names, joining words with "and," and adding endings like -ed, -er, -est, and -ing to our writing. We'll also introduce the concept of the "un" prefix to expand vocabulary. In addition to our literary adventures, it's crucial that your child continues to read at least five times a week at home. We will continue to focus on the use of full stops and enhance our learning with exclamation marks and question marks. Together, we'll write our own imaginative stories inspired by these books and practice reading them aloud. It's sure to be a magical experience for all involved! Thank you for joining us on this literary adventure. Keep an eye out for a letter regarding the upcoming phonics screening check, which will be sent shortly.

Maths



In mathematics this term, we're diving into various concepts. We'll work with numbers up to 100, focusing on multiplication and division. This includes counting in multiples of 2, 5, and 10, as well as solving one-step problems using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and arrays. Additionally, we'll explore fractions by recognizing and naming halves and quarters as equal parts of objects, shapes, or quantities.

Reading

In Year 1, phonics and reading are top priorities. We regularly assess your child's progress in these areas and provide support as needed. Please ensure your child brings their reading book and record every day, as we collect old books during teacher-led reading sessions. Use a school book bag as larger bags won't fit in their tray. Remember to write in your child's reading record at least three times a week for a chance to move along the reading road and get special prizes, reviewed every Friday. English

Core texts: 'Big Bad Owl' and 'Space Tortoise'

WRITING OUTCOMES: To write a fantasy tale, setting description, character description, letter and diary.

- To use capital letters for names of people, places and days of the week.
- To join words and clauses using and.
- To punctuate sentences using a capital letter and a full stop, question mark or exclamation mark.
- To add suffixes where no change is needed to the root word - ed, -ing, -er, -est.
- To add the prefix 'un' to verbs and adjectives to change the meaning e.g. untie, unkind.
- To use simple description.

Composition:

- To re-read what they have written and check that it makes sense.
- To discuss what has been written with the teacher or other pupils.
- To read writing aloud clearly enough to be heard by peers and the teacher.
- To sequence sentences to form short narratives.

Phonics:

- Set 3 Read Write Inc sounds.
- Speedy green words
- Common exception words: - my, here, there, where, love come and some.

Handwriting:

- To continue to write pre cursive letters.
