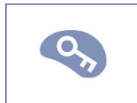

### Year 2 information:

Your child needs to have their reading book and reading record in school every day. We are ensuring children develop a love for reading, ask questions about texts and develop their fluency and accuracy by taking part in our reading road, grouped guided reading sessions and 1:1 reads. Having their reading record in school ensures we can inform you what they are doing well at and what their next steps are.

We ask children to read to an adult at home a **minimum of 3 times per week** to improve their fluency, speed and accuracy.



Although we would like the children to share their school reading book, we also encourage any reading covering a wide range of genres, this can include magazines, leaflets, etc. Please listen to your child read, ask some questions about the book then **sign their reading record**. Any child who reads 3 times and has their reading record signed, will move up our reading road which the children get very excited about! Some children have already earned a golden coin to use in our book vending machine. We know how busy things are at home so your child could write the date and book in themselves and then ask you to sign it. Thank you for your continued support!

Our PE days remain as Tuesday and Friday and children need to come to school in a school PE kit.

## Year 2 Newsletter

### Summer 2



In English, the children will be looking at Grandad's Secret Giant by David Litchfield. They will continue to develop their use of exclamation sentences, questions marks, adverbs and apostrophes for contractions. The children will revisit and review writing a persuasive letter and be working towards a final outcome of a writing a narrative with a moral focus. We will continue to focus on Gateway Keys and Mastery Keys. They will also be reading our diversity text 'The Magic Paintbrush' by a familiar author Julia Donaldson. We will be asking the question: Is it always easy to make the right choice?

In Maths, the children will continue to revisit and review basic skills during fluency sessions. We will continue our learning with volume and then have some time to consolidate Place Value, Addition and Subtraction, Multiplication, Division and Fractions.



In Science we will continue our learning on Materials and their suitability for different products and uses. We will learn about the strength of paper, eco friendly materials and work collaboratively to investigate the best materials to make a pet bed.

In PE, the children will be focusing on the question 'How do I send a ball with control and accuracy?'

During Geography lessons the children will be asking the question: **Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold place?**

They will be locating the North and South Pole and the Equator. They will use their linkage skills to compare weather between the different places and they will find similarities and differences between the UK and other hot and cold countries.

In music the children will look at how music has developed over time. They will investigate how and why it has changed and learn some of the language of music.

During their Design Technology they will be asking the question: What will I put into my healthy flapjack to help keep me healthy for Sports Day? They will investigate existing products, design their own based on a given brief and then make and evaluate.

In RE, the children will consider the key question 'What aspects of life really matter?' within Judaism.

The children will continue to take part in weekly values assemblies where they will recap on learning about our different Chapelford Values. This half term they will look at enterprising, collaborative, dynamic and aspirational values.
