

<u>English:</u>

This half term, the children will be using a book called 'Grandad's Secret Giant', by David Litchfield, to inspire their writing. This is a beautifully illustrated, funny and engaging book with a really lovely message about belonging and friendship. The children will be reading the story and writing in the role of different characters, including Grandad and the giant. They will be producing a final writing outcome of a narrative with a moral focus, they will have lots of discussions about what it means to be a good friend and what it means to belong in the community to support this writing.

Vocabulary: humongous, drainpipe, Gableview, mural, hoisted, mumbled, pickle, chap

Learning Challenge Curriculum: Science

In Science they are continuing to learn about plants. To support this learning, the children have been participating in some gardening to prepare for the Arley Hall gardening competition. The children know what a plant needs to thrive and stay healthy so have been using this knowledge to grow and look after plants. They will be doing some writing to compare healthy and unhealthy plants to demonstrate their understanding.
