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MFL:

One of the most popular subjects to learn over the autumn term was MFL. At Chapelford, we study French as our modern foreign language. It's a fun and engaging subject that is key for developing conversational skills and manners. The children worked hard last term and can greet another person and ask how they are. This half term we will be learning the names of some animals in French and developing our speaking and writing skills by learning how to say what our favourite animal is.

Learning Challenge Curriculum: Science

In Science they are learning about forces and magnets. The children will work scientifically to compare how things move on different surfaces and compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of whether they are attracted to a magnet, and identify some magnetic materials. They will be able to articulate that magnets have two poles and explain how magnets either attract or repel each other.

Key Vocabulary: force, magnetic force, magnet, attract, repel, poles, contact force

Reading in Year 3:

We ask children to read at home a minimum of 5 times per week. In Year 3, the children can read three times with an adult and twice independently, if they wish. Their reading record must still be signed and dated five times in order to complete the reading challenge.

The children can begin to take ownership of their reading record and fill it in themselves, as long as an adult signs it. We have seen lots of children beginning to do this and it is lovely to see them keeping track of their own reading! Any child who reads 5 times will be put into a raffle!

Please ensure your child brings their reading record and reading book in everyday. Thank you for your continued support.

Key Information:
