

<u>English</u>



This half term, in Paperbag Prince, the children have the opportunity to discover the different types of parenthesis and how this can be applied to different genres of texts. Year 5, will also revisit and review some of the relative clause and speech features.

Throughout Room 13, children will develop their motive writing by looking at the atmosphere and creating tension.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term, the children will be finishing their topic of fractions. This includes adding and subtracting them, multiplying, simplifying and equivalent. Their knowledge will then be applied to decimals and percentages.

They will then start to look at geometry, angles and position and direction.

Science – Properties and changes of materials

The children will be learning about Chemistry. This will include looking at how materials change form, the texture/properties and how this may differ in various materials (the plastic handle of a metal pan).

PSHE – Healthy Me

Children will explore what it means to be healthy. This includes their minds and bodies. Their learning will also be linked to healthy habits, laws linked to drugs and how to ask for help with a trusted adult.

MFL

The children will be continuing their learning of French by looking at different weather and countries.

Art and DT

The children will explore artists that create 3D sculpture and apply their knowledge to include textiles. In DT, the children will discover food and nutrition linking to their PSHE learning.

<u> RE – Christianity</u>

The children will continue to discover Christianity and compare and contrast this with the other religions learned so far.

<u>PE</u>

The children will be focusing on net and wall games this half term. They will develop the skills and rules of badminton, they will think about correct technique for a range of shots including drop shot and net shot as well as how to serve accurately.

History

The children will be continuing their learning looking at Ancient Greece, the gods and goddess and democracy.

<u>Geography</u>

The children continue their learning with OS Maps and fieldwork to then apply this to their orienteering skills.
