Important messages for this half term...

<u>English</u>

Class texts: The Hunter by Paul Geraghty

This half term, we will be exploring the text "The Hunter". The children will be focusing on using relative clauses to add information to their writing and developing their descriptive techniques. We will also consider ways of building cohesion across paragraphs, and use adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility. All of these tools will support the children when writing their own narrative based on the text, by changing the characters, animal and setting.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term, the children will be completing their learning on volume and will begin to explore angle, statistics, position and direction and time.

Science – Chemistry- Properties and changes of materials

In this unit, the children will learn to compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, including their hardness, solubility, transparency, conductivity (electrical and thermal), and response to magnets. They will also learn that some materials will dissolve in liquid to form a solution, and how to recover a substance from a solution.

PSHE – Dreams and Goals

This half term, the children will learn more about money; considering decisions on spending and saving. They will also begin thinking about the future and what helps to influence the decisions that we make.

MFL

The children will be continuing their learning of French with a focus on "Going to the beach".

Art and DT

The children will explore artists that create 3D sculpture and apply their knowledge to include textiles. In DT, the children will discover food and nutrition, and using this learning, will make their own bread.

<u>RE – Judaism</u>

Pupil will explore the Jewish faith.

<u>PE</u>

As well as beginning some much needed sports day practice, we will also be practicing our gymnastic skills.

<u>History</u>

The children will complete a research project, comparing the civilisations of the Maya and the Anglo-Saxons.

<u>Geography</u>

The children continue their learning with OS Maps and fieldwork to then apply this to their orienteering skills.
