On Monday 11<sup>th</sup> September saw the launch of Happy Lunchtimes.

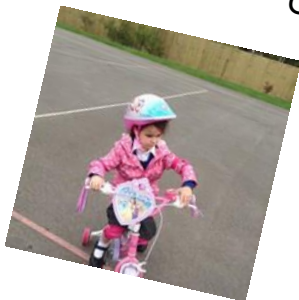

### Cross Country at Great Sankey High School

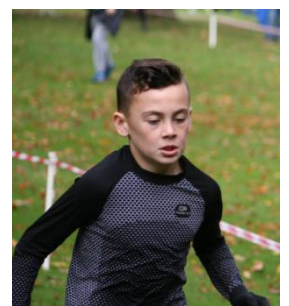
Ten children from Year 5 and 6 were chosen to represent Chapelford at a cluster cross country competition.
