We are focusing on caring for ourselves.

Dear parents, carers and families,

The last couple of weeks have been busy ones. We have had school trips, pupils starting to fundraise and lots of learning. Today is World Mental Health day, we are encouraging the pupils to identify and recognise ways of looking after themselves. We so often talk about caring for others but we also want our pupils to care for themselves, if we teach them this young hopefully they will have strategies to take forward with them.

Each class has their own email address that the class teacher checks, this can be a really useful way of communicating with your child's class teacher, especially if you do not drop off or pick up regularly. All the class emails are the class name and class followed by @chestertonprimary.org eg Oakclass@chestertonprimary.org. Please be aware that these email addresses will only be checked during working hours (between 8.30am-5.00pm) and responses will not be made outside these hours, this leaves a limited time so please be patient when waiting for responses. Anything urgent should be sent to admin@chestertonprimary.org.

Please be aware that in order to make our school safe for all we are a nut free school. This means that any food brought into the school, for example packed lunches, cannot contain nuts.

We seem to be gathering a large amount of lost property. Any item of clothing found lying around the school is put in the boxes in the main reception area, under the window to the office. If your child is missing anything, please have a look there. In order to help clothes be reunited, please name any item of clothing as so much of the uniform is identical and without a name it is hard to return to the right person.
