Dear parents, carers and families,

The last couple of weeks have been very busy for everyone at Chesterton. We had a very successful World Book Day, the children looked fantastic in their word themed costumes. There was clearly a lot of hard work that went in to creating some of the costumes.

We have had a review of our behaviour systems including praise and rewards given. Firstly we have introduced clear and consistent school rules, they are; 1. Respect; we are kind and honest. 2. Persevere: we do our best at our work and play. 3. Care; we take care of our school. We have introduced some new ways of recognising children who are working hard and following our school rules. Children are being given golden wrist bands which have written on them what they have received it for. We are still giving Head Teachers Awards and we will be giving out our first value certificates at the end of this term. Finally we have also introduced house points.

Chesterton Primary School now have school houses. Last week the children were set a challenge to come up with suggestions for house names. We have four houses and several children suggested naming them after precious stones, so the houses are Ruby, Emerald, Sapphire and Amber. The children have been split into the four houses, siblings in the same houses. The children will collect house points for their houses and at the end of each term the house with the highest number of points will have a reward. We hope this will give pupils a sense of community in school and some shared responsibility.

Our current rate of attendance is 92.1%, this is below where we want it to be and we are following up with pupils whose attendance is below the expected level.
