Dear parents, carers and families,

What a great first week we had after Easter. The children came back with enthusiasm for learning and made a great start to this term's learning. Next Monday 2nd May is a bank holiday and the school will be closed.

The meeting will be virtual via zoom and the invite will be sent out via Parentmail on the morning of the meeting. It would be great to see anyone who can help with the fete at the meeting.
