Weekly Subject Focused Project: Understanding the World

Focus: Seasides/Beaches

Key Tasks: What do you know about seasides? Make a mind map about beaches and show pictures of different beaches around the UK but also around the world. Why do they look different? What is the same? What is different? Have a sea side afternoon - ice cream, sun hats, sand pit

open, and paddling pool open outside if you have one, and maybe have a seaside drink outside ©

Suggested tasks:

- Create a beach scene using art materials and real sand if you have any
- Write sentences comparing two beaches (rocky beach in the UK and a sandy beach in spain)



Phonics - recapping old sounds that have already been taught in school.

- H https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=NBJmplc3XIQ prior to the lesson write the words on paper and put them in a hat (hat, hill, hiss, how, hot, hut). Go on a hat hunt how many hats can you find? Everyone put a hat on and say h, h, I want my hat back. Then practice writing the letter 'h'. take your hat off and pull out the words and sound them out. The write the words: hut, hats, hill. Then write a sentence with these words.
- B https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=MSPTL8_DyKw prior to the lesson dress up as an astronaut and hold a baby in your arms. As you hold the baby say 'b, b, baby'. Then using 'moon dust' (flour) write the letter 'b' with your finger. Then practice writing the words: bank, bit, bin, band and then write a sentence with one of these words eg: The band were playing in the bank as they opened.
- F/FF https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=L5uJaIhuN3U take a trip to a forest, take a clipboard with you and say 'f, f, foggy forest'. Hide magical 'f' words around the forest area and go on a hunt to sound out the words on the paper (fox, fog, fit, fun, fan) then practice writing sentences.

Letters and sounds which is a different phonics scheme are setting up daily lessons on your tube. They have different actions and captions however the sounds are the same as ous. If you would like to use this as an additional phonics session please use the following link:

Reading: Inference Task

Read a book for 15 minutes a day and discuss the story thinking about the plot, characters, setting, problems and solutions in the story <u>or</u> have a go at using your inference skills to discuss this picture.



- 1. What is happening in the picture?
 - 2. Where are could they be?
 - 3. How did they get there?
 - 4. What problem could occur?
- 5. Choose 3 people from the picture,
 Describe how they are feeling and why



English: The Rainbow Fish - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=QFORvXhub28

Monday: Explain to the children that today they will have to use clues to work out what the story will be about. Show/play 30 seconds of the video of underwater sounds https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=5bN6VNTXrIE - where do you think this story might be taking place? What could it be about? Then show a fish bowl -what animal do you think our story will be about? Read 'The Rainbow Fish'

<u>Tuesday:</u> Show the story of 'The Rainbow Fish'. Read the title and the author's name – what does an author do? Open the book towards your body. (Prepare the book before the lesson, put multi-coloured glitter inside) and create awe and wonder by hooking the children in as they watch the glitter sprinkle out. Order the story using the picture cards.

Wednesday: Recap the story, What happened in the story? Start to draw the story map for the story and practice the actions as you go along.

Thursday: Continue to learn the story map. Draw the pictures and practice line by line saying the story (see attached) and include the actions.

Friday: continue to learn the story map - record yourself saying the story map using the pictures to help you remember the words.



Maths: To count reliably to 20

Monday: Count to 10 march. Then jump to 20. Explain that counting helps us all the time - What things can we count? How many fish are in the book? Can you write the number on your WB? Show page by page

<u>Tuesday</u>: Show under the sea animals (see attached animals) - can you say the number on the animal? Can you order the animals? Use counters or cubes or household objects to count out - can you count out the correct number of objects for each animal to 20?

Wednesday: Play: https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/underwater-counting. Write the number of animals they can see.

Thursday: count out a group of 20 objects - check they can count accurately. Then put 10 of the objects in groups of 2's and count them in 2's together. (2, 4, 6, 8, 10) explain that we can count in 1's or in 2's.

Friday: roll two dice together - use the objects to count out the correct number that has been rolled. You can use any objects you find.

Addiontional Suggested Activities

Roleplay: pretend you are at the beach, dress up in yoru beach clothes, take a towel and sunglasses and enjoy sunbathing in the sun (with suncream on) then pretend to build sandcastles and if you have a paddling pool you can pretend you are in the sea.

Small world: create an under the sea scene - use sea animals, boats and water if you can. Maybe use your paddling pool outside.

Gross motor: play the game sharks and fishes with your family - its like the game 'tag' but you choose one person to be the shark and the others are the fishes who get caught. See if you can find a fun way of setting the fish free.

Art: open ended junk modelling challenge - what can you make? Use materials to create your own rainbow fish.

Understanding the world: read books on sea animals - what facts do you know? Share them with a friend or make your own fact book

Maths: In a water tray, add glitter and children can measure different amounts of water to fill the 'fish bowl' – add keywords for capacity (full, half full, empty etc)





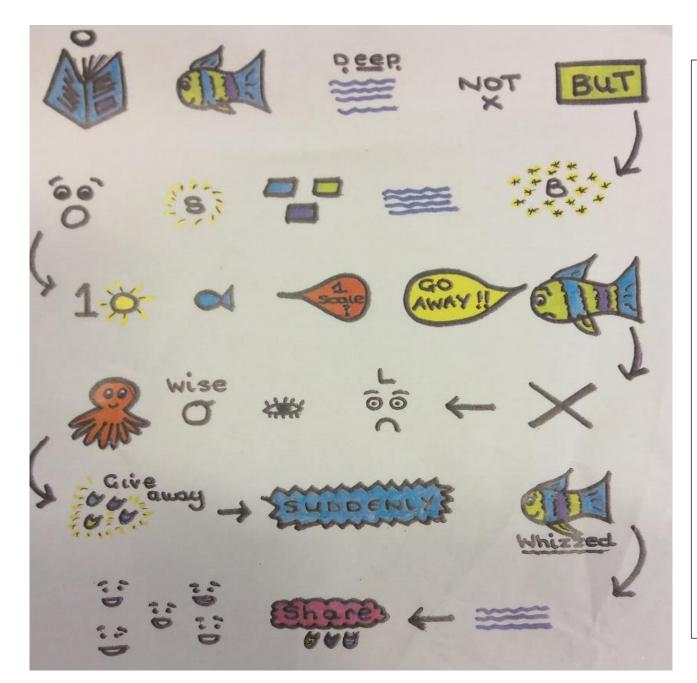




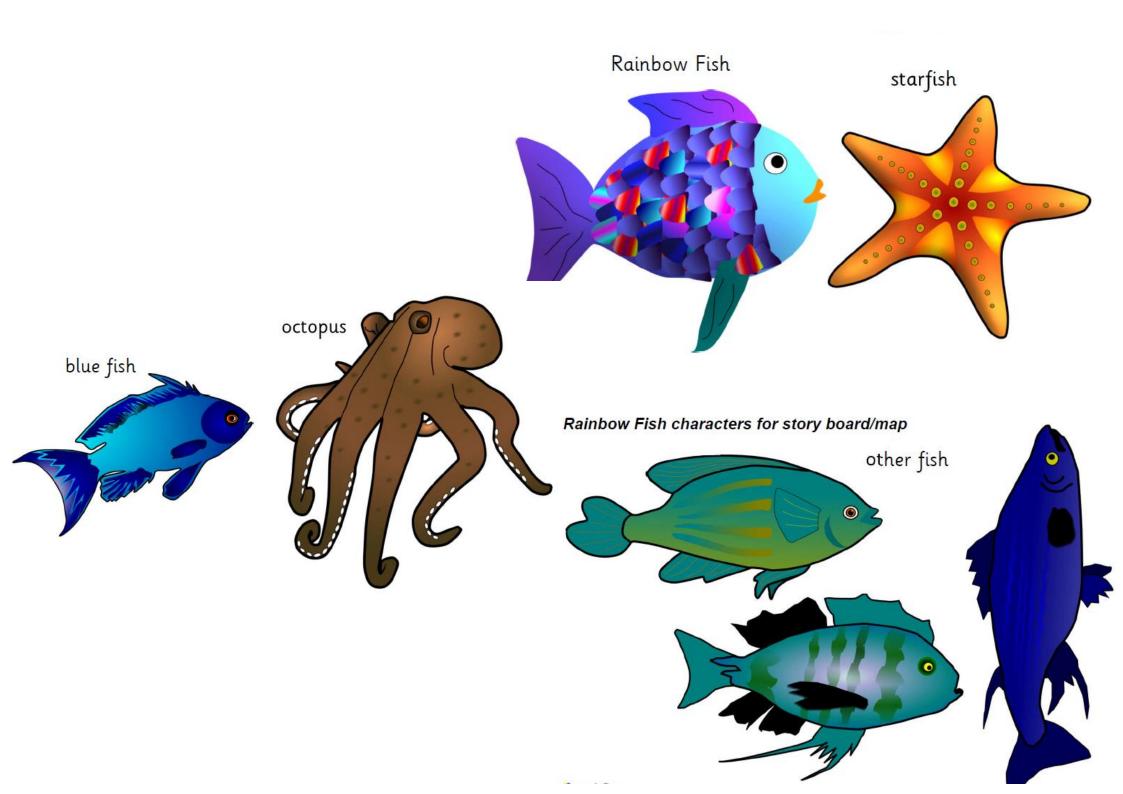


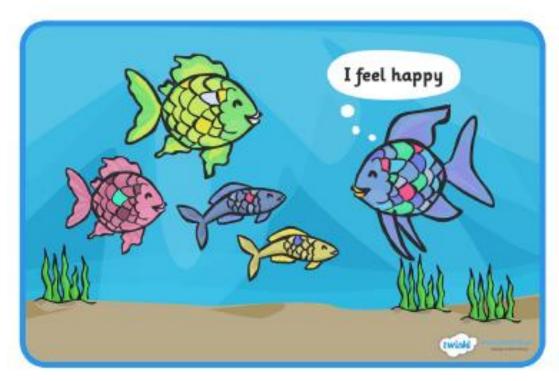


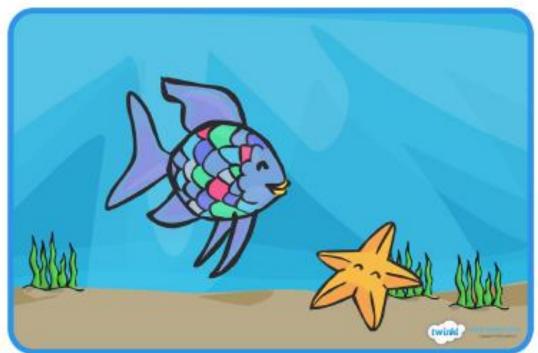


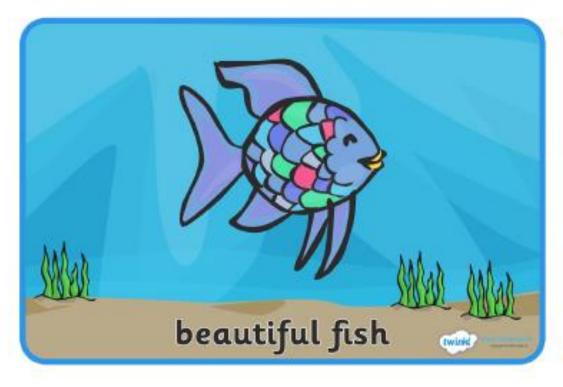


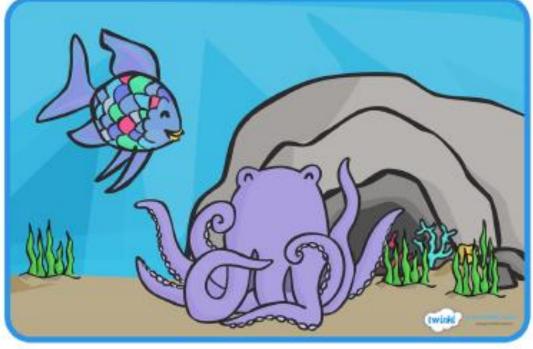
