P.E.

Follow along with Joe Wicks on you tube at 9.00am every day to keep fit and healthy. If you have not access to You tube, can your child make up their own workout or dance routine. 'Go noodle', 'Cosmic Yoga' and 'Just Dance' are also great alternatives.

Creative (Music, Art, Drama)

Create your own summer pictures. Try to make ice cream cones and use collage, glitter or colours to create different toppings. Or create a beach scene using sand and paint. Use junk modelling to make a sea side attraction like a helter-skelter or a carousel.

Phonics - recapping previous sounds that have already been taught in school.

English

Continuous Provision

Small world: use your imagination to create fantasy or everyday worlds. You can use any small toys you have at home - barbies, cars, lego, dolls, teddies. In school we are going to have a police station with a police car, jail, police people, and a finger print station using paint and paper.

Gross motor: have some races with your siblings - try a hopping race, running race or even a slow walking race.

Construction: use only empty toilet roll tubes, sello-tape/masking tape and scissors to see what you can construct and build

Art: ice cream pictures, summer scene pictures, junk modelling open ended challenge,
