Weekly Subject Focused Project: Science

Big Question: Where do we live? (animals)

Focus: Animal habitats

<u>Key Tasks</u>: show pictures of a range of animals (see sheet attached) alongside a variety of habitats. Eg: whale, fox, tiger, polar bears - ocean, woodland, jungle, arctic. Then match the animals to the correct habitat. Discuss why the animal would be best suited to live there and why.

Phonics

- D https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=f8_Mul4Odk prior to the lesson write words starting with 'd' on paper and hide them in some soil. Children to go outside and dig to find the words then sound them out. Model writing the 'd' letter in the soil with a stick. Then write a sentence with these words in: dig, dog, dot Eg: The dog is brown, the dot is big,
- G https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WgGtRh7MTB4. Listen to the story with a teddy bear, go outside and practice writing the 'g' letter on some leaves. Then practice writing some words with the 'g' sound in it (get, gap, grump). Try putting one of these words in a sentence.

Letters and sounds which is a different phonics scheme to ours are setting up daily lessons on your tube. They have different actions and captions however the sounds are the same as our scheme. If you would like to use this as an additional phonics session please use the following link:

Reading: Hiccups

Read a book for 15 minutes a day and discuss the story <u>or</u> read along with an adult online for the following story https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2sKNOu3igdw

- Recall 3 things that Kipper tried to do to get rid of his hiccups
- How many people tried to help Kipper?
- How was kipper feeling when he had hiccups? Can you use a WOW word (annoyed, frustrated, fed up)



English: Owl Babies

Monday: recap the story of 'The Oul Babies' - draw your own story map of the story using pictures. See attached example.

Tuesday: retell the story using your story map or the book. Then put a small piece of paper over the owls. You are going to change the characters in the story. What animal could it be? Which animal would be in a woodland? Talk about what your new animals look like

Wednesday: using your story map with the covered owls, draw your new animals on your story map and make up a new action.

Thursday: retell your story with your new characters Eg: The fox babies.

<u>Friday</u>: draw a picture of your new characters. Write 4 sentences to describe them. *Eg. the foxes are brown and they have soft fur.*

Maths: Substaction

Monday: Solve simple subtraction sentences to 10 by using pictures eg: (please correct any incorrect number formation)

Tuesday: go outside and collect 10 sticks and 10 leaves. Make number sentences with these objects eg:4 leaves - 2sticks = 2 left.

Wednesday: use a stick and write out number sentences in mud/sand or use water on the floor. Eg: 10-8=2

Thursday: if you have a dice, use this to create your own number sentences by rolling it. Make sure the bigger number goes first Friday: show the numberline below or use a ruler to solve subtraction sentences by jumping backwards. If you have access to a computer, use: https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/. Here you will be able to access a lesson a day of maths, there is a video of what to do



Addiontional Suggested Activities

Roleplay: create a farm shop - what would be sold in your shop? Make foods and tills with junk modeling. Make fake money put of paper or borrow some Ip, 2p and 5p coins from your grown ups to pretend to have real customers buying items from your shop.

Small world: make a farm scene using foods/materials. Make animals out of junk if you don't have any at home.

Cooking: Im feeling very hungry and I'd love to see some homemade pizza's this week

Gross motor: practice your football skills by kicking around a ball. Create your own cones by using household items (check with grown ups before you use anything from the house)
