

# Oak Class Parent Information 2021-2022



Welcome to Oak Class. We are the Year 6 class at Chesterton Primary school.

Mrs Chapman teaches Oak Class, with support from Miss Clilverd and Mrs Hooper.

The learning in Year 6 is organised in a range of ways and includes whole-class, group and independent activities. All lessons vary but a typical session may include a whole-class input interspersed with some peer discussion that is developed with some focused learning tasks, which are typically differentiated to four levels of challenge. The children choose the level of challenge they work at, although the teacher provides guidance, and then they are supported to work independently to establish not just their fluency but also their ability to apply that learning to context.

The majority of our learning stems from investigating BIG questions which we discuss at the start of a new unit of work as a whole-class and which we then work towards answering by developing our store of key knowledge and applying it to a specific situation. These BIG questions are linked to our choice of texts in both English and Guided Reading in order to enhance and deepen the children's understanding of the key issues under examination.

Each half term, we also focus on one of our school's core values: Respect, Persevere and Care. This learning will be linked through the delivery of our foundation subjects and where possible to core learning tasks in order to establish a positive mind-set and develop essential life-long learning skills and values.

# Curriculum Overview - Core Subjects

#### Maths

The maths scheme of learning which is followed at Chesterton Primary School closely follows that suggested by White Rose. Each maths session targets new learning through the application of fluency skills and develops them through application to a real-life problem-solving context. Reinforcement lessons are employed as necessary to ensure that mastery of key objectives is achieved. The following hyperlinks show a detailed overview of the content for each term.

## English

At Chesterton Primary School we adopt the Talk for Writing apporach which means that talking the text is key. The process begins with a 'cold write' task which allows the class teacher to idnentify priorities and direct teaching as appropriate. Then we learn a short text by heart, mapping it out and exploring the vocabulary. We make links to other texts by reading as a reader which might involve some short burst writing. We then examine the writer's techniques and start to build a toolkit which we can employ in our own writing. This is reinforced with opportuities for shared and independent writing activities. When fully confident with the text type and tools, which will make our writing successful, we complete a 'hot write' which allows us to show off everything we have learnt.

Texts each term are chosen to support the half-termly themes wherever possible to help reinforce learning.

- A weekly assessment for spelling, arithmetic and GPaS (Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling) takes place every **Friday** morning.
- Reading Records are collected and reviewed every Thursday morning.
- Y6 Pixel Assessments take place each half term (3 maths papers, 1 reading paper, 2 GPaS papers). The results of these papers are used to direct teaching to address any misconceptions/gaps.
- Statutory Assessment (SATS) for the end of KS2 take place in May.

   Year 6 is planned for the beginning of Spring 1.
