We went for a cycle ride along the Cam and made expanded noun phrases out of the things we saw.

For example: an angry cow running wildly was the thing we saw. The main noun there is 'cow' and we expanded it with all of the other detail. I can now use this in a sentence. For example, simply: We saw an angry cow running wildly.

Or, if I was feeling more adventurous: On our way along the river, we saw an angry cow running wildly, which made us pedal a little bit faster.

From now until the end of term, we will follow a 'Talk for Writing' unit of work, eventually producing our own Guide to Elves and Sprites.


There are example texts, vocabulary tasks, drawing activities and reading challenges to complete along the way, before mapping and producing our own writing at the end of term.
