Make your own herbal remedy that Mary Seacole would've used in the war: With an adult's help make a lemon tea used to help coughs.




Mary's Herbal Remedies

Mary used herbal remedies she had learnt from her mother to treat the soldiers.

She would often grind them in a pestle and mortar, mix them in a bowl or heat them over a fire.

Some of the ingredients she used included:

- · Aloe Vera mixed to help heal cuts and wounds.
- · Lemongrass boiled to help a fever.
- Ginger ground to help diarrhoea.
- · Lemons mixed to help coughs.
- · Okra chopped to help heal boils.


Use a coloured pencil to edit your work. Have you missed any full stops or capital letters? Have you made any spelling mistakes? Could you add any extra describing words?





