The official World Book Day is on Thursday 7th March - don't let this confuse you!

Please have a chat with your child/ren and help them to decide on 1 or 2 books (no more than 2) that they are willing to part with and bring them in on Monday 4th and Tuesday 5th March so that we can start to sort them ready for our Book Swap. We do understand that some families may find it more difficult to contribute, but with some children bringing in 2 books we will have enough for everyone!

EASTER CELEBRATIONS

The term is moving on apace and we are now thinking about the Easter Festival. Kingfisher Class will be leading our Easter Service, which will be held on Thursday 28th March at St Andrews Church starting at 9.30am.

On Wednesday 27th March we will be holding our Easter Eggshibition; details are as follows:



• Children will be able to enter a decorated egg from home (the egg should be either blown or hardboiled)

• 2 items (different to the home item) will be produced in school

• Home-made items should be clearly labelled on the bottom (out of sight) with the child's name, class and age

• Entries should be brought in to school first thing on Wednesday 27th March. Judging will take place after lunch

- The children will have an opportunity to look around the displayed entries once the judging is finished. Parents are welcome to view our Eggshibition from 2.40pm
- Certificates will be awarded for the first three places in each class.

VALLEY ARTS EASTER HOLIDAY DRAMA CLUB

We are very lucky to have the excellent **Stevie Thompson**, Artistic Director of Flibbertigibbet Theatre (<u>www.flibbertigibbettheatre.co.uk</u>) coming to run a 2 day clowning and comedy workshop on **Tuesday 9th and Wednesday 10th April**, at **The Baptist Church**, **Chew Magna**.

This 2-day workshop is designed to help children aged 7 - 13 develop their physical storytelling skills and create their own comic characters. Over the course of the workshop, we will explore the art of clowning and slapstick comedy, and introduce the group to the silent movie greats, Charlie Chaplin, Buster Keaton, Harold Lloyd, exploring their inspirations taken from pantomime and Commedia Dell'Arte. Why are some things still funny?! The group will learn how to use props and costumes to create hilarious routines as well as delving into the world of masks to discover how they can be used to tell stories and express emotions. No prior experience is necessary, and all materials will be provided.



Cost is £48 for 2 days, and the running time of the workshop is 10am - 4pm both days. Parents and carers will be invited to come and watch the group share back some of the skills they have learnt, at the end of the second day.
