#### RAAC

You may have seen recent media coverage regarding Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC) and its use in educational settings. RAAC is a lightweight form of concrete; because it is weaker than regular concrete, concerns have been raised about its long-term durability. The Department for Education (DfE) has recently changed its guidance to education settings on the management of RAAC to take a more precautionary approach. We wanted to inform you that a full structural survey of the school has been undertaken and we do not have RAAC in any of our buildings.

#### CLIMBING CLUB

Following our note in the last newsletter of last term, we can confirm that we will be running Climbing Club after half term. The club will run on Wednesdays starting on  $1^{st}$  November for 5 weeks. The sessions will start at 4.30pm for 1 hour and would take place at Redpoint Climbing Centre, Winterstoke Road, Bristol. Please note that we are unable to offer transport to and from the sessions so parents would have to make their own arrangements in this respect. The cost would be in the region of £55 for 5 sessions.

Parents who previously expressed an interest online should sign up and pay on ParentPay as soon as possible to secure their child's place. There will initially be 6 spaces available but if there is sufficient interest we will open up another 6 spaces.
