Through this scheme we have aimed to improve the number of children cycling, scooting and park and striding to school as well as educating children about how to do this safely,



the health benefits of travelling in these ways and the positive impact this has on our environment. Miss Hennessy and the PE Council have been busy working towards their accreditations. We can proudly announce we continue to be a Platinum school, who have won both the local and regional school of the year awards for the third year in a row. We will be attending the England final in London in March. We think these accolades demonstrate the

school's commitment to promoting safe and active sustainable travel to and from school. We are incredibly grateful to our parents who continue to encourage our children to travel to school in a sustainable way and consider our Car-Free zone if they need to use the car, so they can park and stride.

SICKNESS AND ABSENCE REPORTING

You will have heard in the news recently about the Government's initiative to drive up school attendance. We are now having regular contact with the local authority's attendance officers and one of the areas they look at is the reason for a child's absence. Could we therefore ask parents to let us know why your child is absent - the attendance officers will not accept 'poorly' as a reason, so could we please have a little more detail? Thank you.

GET YOUR BIKE READY FOR WINTER WITH A FREE DR BIKE CHECK

We are delighted to offer parents the chance to have their children's bikes checked by a qualified cycle mechanic from B&NES Bikeability. The mechanic can check up to 10 bikes a day over 3 days so spaces will be offered on a first come, first served basis. Please note that Dr Bike is not a comprehensive bike service but an opportunity to get a free bike safety check, have minor repairs carried out on the spot, and receive a prescription that identifies areas which require further work. If done during winter, parents know their child's bike is roadworthy for Spring, Summer, and Autumn.

Dr Bike will be visiting us on the 4^{th} , 5^{th} and 6^{th} December during school hours. Bikes should be brought to school at drop-off time and collected at the end of school. Please be aware that the school cannot be held liable for the loss of or damage to your child's bicycle whilst on school premises.
