I would like to take this opportunity to draw your attention to a scheme which the school has been working very closely with since 2018. We are very proud that Chew Stoke Church has School been working with Modeshift Stars, a scheme which aims to promote safe, active sustainable and

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travel. Through this scheme we have aimed to improve the number of children cycling, scooting and park and striding to school as well as educating children about how to do this safely, the health benefits of travelling in these ways and the positive impact this has on our environment. Miss Hennessy and the PE Council have been busy working towards their accreditations, despite a global pandemic. We can proudly announce we are currently a Platinum school, who have won both the local and regional school of the year awards. We

think these accolades demonstrate the school's commitment to promoting safe and active sustainable travel to and from school. We are incredibly grateful to our parents who continue to encourage our children to travel to school in a sustainable way and consider our Car-Free zone if they are needing to use the car, so they can park and stride.

The Festive season is moving closer and we are just a few weeks away from the start of our Christmas celebrations in school. Our Christingle service at St Andrew's Church will be held on Wednesday 7th December at 6.30pm. You will shortly be receiving a candle and collection envelope together with instructions for making your Christingle (spares are available from the

School Office). We hope you will be able to join us for this magical and very special start to Christmas.

After a three year break due to Covid we are finally able to reinstate our Christmas theatre trips. As a school we feel it benefits the children hugely to be able to see live performances. Children in Key Stage 2 will be seeing a production of 'Five Children and It' at the Egg Theatre in Bath and children in Reception and Key Stage 1 will see 'Belle and Sebastien' at the Bristol Old Vic. More details will follow shortly.

Our annual Christmas Craft Day takes place on Thursday 1st December; this is also a super day in school and certainly gets us all in the Christmas spirit. The children may wear non-school uniform; in exchange for wearing 'home clothes' we are asking children to bring in a bottle or box of chocolates which we will donate to the PTA for their Bottle Stall at the Christmas Fair on the 2nd December. Parents are warmly invited to join us on Craft Day. It may be necessary to limit the number of parents in a classroom at any one time, so please only sign up for either a morning session or an afternoon session and we do require parents to leave the site during our lunch break. If necessary we will split the morning session into two parts. **Please sign up by 9am on Wednesday 23rd November**. Next Friday we will be raising money for Children in Need - this will be a non-school uniform day.

You may have noticed that we have recently got a new website for the school. This has a more modern design and is hopefully easier for you to find information when you need it. Today the children in Kingfisher Class led a beautiful Remembrance Service for their parents and the school. We were so proud of how well they all spoke, sang and the respect that they showed. Thank you to our Badger Class children who have been selling poppies this week; we will let you know shortly how much we raised.

Starting on Monday 14th November, we will be holding a Road Safety Awareness Week. Throughout this week we will be holding a number of assemblies, lessons, a breakfast and competitions which will promote safe, active and sustainable travel. Children in Key Stages 1 and 2 will be learning the importance of being bright now the clocks have changed; in EYFS they will be taking part in pedestrian training and learning the importance of holding hands with an adult when walking to and from school. We will be holding an intra-school competition throughout the week to see which class can complete the most journeys to school on a bike or scooter. We have lots of racks in school where scooters and bikes can be left throughout the day. The PE Council will tally the numbers in each class and the class with the highest number of journeys will win this year's trophy. To thank the children who have travelled to school using their bikes and scooters we will be hosting a breakfast in the school hall on Thursday 17th November from 8:30am. We hope this themed week will encourage children to cycle and scoot to school more frequently and thank you for your support with our continued work with Modeshift Stars.

MEDICINES IN SCHOOL

We have recently noted a few children bringing medication into school in their bags to selfadminister during the day. This is NOT allowed under any circumstances and all medicines should be delivered to the School Office for safe-keeping and supervised administration by a member of staff.
