About us

In September 2012 the school converted to academy status as a Single Academy Trust - an exciting change in the history of the school. Prior to this, all government funding for the school came through B&NES Council. As an academy that funding now comes from the government direct to the school and the school is able to manage that funding to ensure the very best education continues to be offered to children who learn here. The academy trust has a board of directors (also known as governors). Strong governance sits at the heart of our trust and our Board of Governors meet regularly to oversee and guide our work.

The school underwent a full inspection by Ofsted in October 2014 and a short inspection in June 2018, at which time we were judged to be 'Good'. We also had a Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) in March 2019, where we were judged to be 'Excellent'
