NATIONAL VIRTUAL COMMONWEALTH GAMES

Our school is taking part in the National Virtual Commonwealth Games during the summer term. The Commonwealth Games brings nations together in a colourful celebration of sport and human performance. Underpinned by the core values of humanity, equality and destiny, the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games aim to unite the Commonwealth family through a festival of sport and culture. Often referred to as the 'Friendly Games', the event is renowned for inspiring athletes to compete in the spirit of friendship and fair play. There has never been a more important time to galvanise and drive the positive impact of sport on society. Using the values, we wish to inspire and motivate young people to create a long-lasting legacy.

Each month there are virtual challenges for young people to take part in, inspired by the three values:-

Humanity:

14 March-14 April (the Commonwealth Sports Movement's purpose and potential is inspired by athletes and citizen)

Equality:

25 April-27 May (the Commonwealth Sports Movement's sports and Games are a level-playing field, bringing people together as equals)

Destiny:

07 June-08 July (together, the Commonwealth Sports Movement can create a more peaceful, sustainable, and prosperous future)

Each theme includes **three challenges** (attached), which are examples of how it is possible to use a high-profile event to engage children and young people. These challenges will help develop physical literacy skills, strength, or aerobic capacity, whilst aiming to inspire children and young people to be more active. Also attached are personal challenge sheets for your child to keep track of their scores.

We will be talking about this event regularly in school and we hope you will encourage your child to take part at home as well.

SAILING CLUB - SUMMER TERM

Miss Hennessy is looking into running a sailing club again this summer for pupils in Key Stage 2. Sadly, the company are no longer running sessions from Chew Valley Lake, but they have offered us sessions at the Harbourside in Bristol. At the moment we are looking at 5 weeks on a Thursday starting the second week back after the May half term. The sessions are 2.5 hours long and will start at 4:30pm to allow time to get there. The children will be in groups of 9 and we need to fill 2 groups to make the club cost-effective. The cost will be in the region of £56 for the 5 weeks but this will be confirmed.
