MODESHIFT STARS

This year we have decided as a school to renew our Modeshift Stars Gold Award status. Modeshift Stars helps us to consider ways we can further improve the amount of physical activity our children are taking part in every day. One of the ways we are going to increase physical activity is by encouraging children to use more sustainable methods of travel and being more active on their way to and from school. Modeshift Stars is a national awards scheme that recognises schools that have shown excellence in supporting cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable travel. We have already kick-started the year with road safety assemblies, Hedgehog Class have taken part in the Road Safety Week and we have had a Walk to School day. Throughout the year, with the help of our PE Council we will have competitions linked to cycling/ scooting, time spent in class teaching children about the health benefits of active travel and we hope to increase our Walk to School days.
