## INTRODUCTION FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Next Wednesday (29<sup>th</sup> September) we will be taking part in the National Talk like a Pirate Day. This is a literacy event for the whole school and children will spend the day in their classes taking part in pirate-themed activities organised by class teachers. To help children engage with this event we are inviting everyone to come to school dressed as pirates, so look out those tricorne hats and get ready to buckle your swashes!

On Tuesday we had our first visit from our new Anglican Minister Rev. Ian Mills. Ian led a fantastic Worship for us and taught the children a new hymn. Ian is an accomplished musician and the children were captivated by his piano playing - please do ask them about it. Ian has asked for some children to help out at St Andrew's Harvest Service on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October. The children will help handing out hymn books etc. The service starts at 10.30am, children would need to be at the church at 10.15am.
