Modeshift Stars is the Centre of Excellence for the delivery of Effective Travel Plans in Education, Business and Community settings. The scheme recognises schools, businesses and other organisations that have shown excellence in supporting cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable and active travel. We can proudly announce that Chew Stoke Church School has won the Stars Local Authority Primary School of the Year and Regional Primary School of the Year for our work with sustainable and active travel. This is a huge achievement as we were up against all of the other schools in the South West of England. As the winning school of the regional award we will automatically be put forward for the National Award later in the year, which will take place at the Houses of Parliament!

Chew Stoke Church School have been striving to promote cycling and scooting across the whole school. Their PE Council have also led their own project to increase the number of children cycling and scooting to school and as a result more than tripled the number of children actively travelling to school in both EYFS/ KS1 and KS2.
